Day 1 - Depart Canada

Transfer to Toronto airport for overnight flight to Manchester, England.

Day 2 - Arrival Manchester - Lake District

Meet Travel Director and drive through the scenic Lake District of Windermere and Keswick. Arrive in the Lake District for one night. Enjoy a welcome drink and dinner.

Day 3 - Durham - Vindolanda - York

Today see Hadrian's Wall and visit the Housteads Roman Fort and Roman Vindolanda. Visit the Durham Dales Visitor Centre. Travel to York via the North York Moors for a three night stay. **B,I**

Day 4 - Keswick - Durham

Travel to Whitby and visit Castle Howard.

Day 5 - York

The day is yours to explore York at your own pace. Optional visits to York Minster, The Shambles, the Railway Museum and Jorvik Viking Centre

Day 6 - York - Newark - Leicester

Travel to Lincoln to visit the Cathedral, home to the Magna Carta.

Then continue to Newark to visit the National Civil War Centre.

Arrive in Leicester for 4 night stay.

Day 7 - Leicester - Ironbridge Excursion (Re. Industrial Revolution)

Visit Ironbridge, World Heritage Site of the Ironbridge Gorge. Also visit the China Museum, Tar Tunnel and the Museum of Iron.

Day 8 - Leiscester Sightseeing

Visit Battle of Bosworth. Visit Leicester Cathedral and Richard III visitor centre.

Day 9 - Leicester - Duxford Excursion

Travel to Duxford to visit the Imperial War Museum (Air). Return to Leicester via Cambridge, if time permits.

Day 10 - Leicester - Tunbridge Wells

Visit Bletchley Park (WWII Ultra Secret) then continue on to Tunbridge Wells for a five night stay.

Day 11 - Tunbridge Wells - Chartwell/Quebec House Excursion

Travel to Westerham to visit General Wolfe's home, Quebec House. Later, visit Winston Churchill's home, Chartwell.

Day 12 - Tunbridge Wells - Greenwich Excursion

Travel to London and Greenwich. Visit the National Maritime Museum.

Day 13 - Tunbridge Wells - Portsmouth Excursion

Travel to Portsmouth to visit the Historic Dockyard. Then return to Tunbridge Wells via scenic South Downs National Park.

Day 14 - Tunbridge Wells - Maidstone Excursion

Visit the Battle site of 1066 and then see Bodiam Castle. Later, travel to Maidstone to visit Leeds Castle. Cap off the trip with a farewell dinner with entertainment.
