Friday, June 9

Travel day to Shipshewana, Indiana. Shipshewana and LaGrange County is home to the third largest Amish community in the U.S. We will observe, learn, and pay tribute to this community's simple way of life.

Saturday, June 10 B, L, D

This morning, we meet our Amish guide and begin touring the Shipshewana area which may include a visit to a casket, buggy and wind chime maker and a camel farm. After enjoying a home style cooked Amish lunch, it is time to leave for our stay at the AAA four-diamond Historic French Lick Resort, nestled among the hills of the Hoosier National Forest. This is where Chef Louis Perrin created the first tomato juice as a drink after he ran out of oranges. In 1958, women's competitive golf got its start in French Lick, titled the "French Lick Women's Open".

Sunday, June 11 BB

Today begin your day with a delicious buffet breakfast in the former ballroom where FDR received the nomination to run for president in 1931. Our adventure begins with a guided tour of the national historic landmark, West Baden Springs Hotel, once called the "8th wonder of the world". We then tour the First Chance Center Factory where donations of discarded fabrics are accepted and redesigned as one-of-a-kind products sold under the name of Envision Designs. All profits from the sales goes to fund the programs and services at the First Chance Center for individuals with disabilities. Later in the afternoon, ride the French Lick Scenic Railway Train which boast one of the most scenic ride through the beautiful Hoosier Forest and through the Burton Tunnel a 2,200 foot-long that was cut through shale and limestone.

Monday, June 12

Our destination today is the Monastery Immaculate Conception founded by the Sisters of St. Benedict who came to Ferdinand, Indiana to fill a need for German speaking teachers and make a difference in the lives of local setters. We will learn their history with a guided tour of the Monastery. There will be time for shopping in the gift shop and the bake shop. The afternoon is free for you to enjoy a buggy ride through the French Lick property, a golf game, or simply relax and enjoy the surroundings.

Today, we travel to Wheeling West Virginia for our two night stay at the Oglebay Resort & Conference Center which offers 1,700 acres of lodging. Enjoy the beautifully landscaped sixteen acre gardens, 4 golf courses including two championship courses, tennis courts, horse stables, pedal boating, miniature golf, walking trails, and much more.

Wednesday, June 14

This morning after our mountaineer breakfast, we meet our local guide for a tour of Wheeling, West Virginia. In the early afternoon, visit the Carriage House Glass Museum which displays 3,000 displays of cut lead crystal, Victorian art glass, Peach blow glass, Northwood's carnival glass, Pattern and Depression glass, and a live glass working demonstration revealing the skill and artistry required to create intriguing and beautiful pieces. The remaining afternoon is on your own for a game of golf, relaxation or shopping.

Thursday, June 15

Before we say our farewells, we have time to visit the Oglebay Institute Mansion Museum, an elegant and educational 1846 summer home of Cleveland industrialist, Earl W. Oglebay. The mansion became part of the national register of historic places in 1979. After this interesting visit it is now time to board our coach and return home with a stop at the duty free shop.
