Sunday, April 29

Today indulge in Minoan history at the world famous archaeological site of Knossos Palace. Learn the story behind Sir Arthur Evan's excavations and wonder over the 4,000 year old Minoan artifacts. From here, onto the Archaeological Museum in the island's capital of Heraklion. Enjoy a sumptuous meal at a tavern on the historic Venetian Harbour in Chania.

Monday, April 30

Visit Biolea, a family-owned company specializing in the artisan production of olive oil. From here, travel on to the beautiful gorge of Deliana to see the stunning rock formations, plant life and varied bird life. A packed lunch will be provided.

Tuesday, May 1

A free day to explore the local area or take a bus into Chania city for some sightseeing and shopping.

Wednesday, May 2

Take part in a coastal walk which takes about 2.5 hours. This stunning walk along the Rotherpou Peninsula starts in the ancient village of Nopigia, passing the remains of a Hellenistic harbour and ascends to great heights overlooking the Kissamos Bay. We finish in the traditional village of Ravdouha for lunch.

Thursday, May 3

Take a day trip to the village of Loutro, which is only accessible by boat. Start with a drive to historic Sfakia made famous by the evacuation of Allied Troops during the Battle of Crete. A private boat will take us along rugged coastline to secluded Sweetwater Bay for a swim in the Libyan Sea, and refreshments. From here, travel up the coast to the picturesque village of Loutro for a leisurely lunch.
