Sunday, May 5

Fly to the famous city of New Orleans, known for its Mardi Gras celebrations and Creole hospitality. A complex system of levees, drainage canals and pumps keep the city dry, as it is located below sea level. Enjoy a four-night stay at the four-diamond **Crowne Plaza New Orleans French Quarter Hotel**, situated at the gateway of the French Quarter.

Monday, May 6

BB

Explore New Orleans with a local guide on a sightseeing tour, of the French Quarter – the heart and soul of the city, the above ground cemetery, and Café du Monde – the historic, open-air coffee stand that has been a fixture since 1862 serving beignet. Following lunch, experience the unique adventure of a narrated Louisiana swamp tour, possibly getting up close with an alligator.

Tuesday, May 7

BB, L

Tour one of the largest antebellum plantation houses in the south, the Nottoway Plantation House – a 64 room mansion, completed in 1859, on 7,000 acres, at a size

of 53,000 square feet. Following the tour, a traditional Louisiana style lunch is served. Named for the two rows of live oaks planned in the 1700's that form an alley from the Mississippi River to the mansion, enjoy a tour of Oak Alley Plantation with knowledgeable guides dressed in period costume.

Wednesday, May 8

BB, D

Today is free to explore New Orleans on your own. The dinner this evening is onboard the Steamboat Natchez, while it cruises the mighty Mississippi River. Viewing the city from this stern-wheel steamboat, enjoying a buffet of New Orleans favourites, and being serenaded by a jazz band is a delightful experience.

Thursday, May 9
