How to book: Reservations may be made through any CAA Niagara office. A non-refundable deposit of \$500 per person is due at time of booking. Second deposit of \$5,000 is due March 1, 2020. Balance of payment is due June 12, 2020. Bookings made after June 12, 2020 will require full payment at time of booking. CAA strongly recommends the purchase of travel insurance. Ask for details.

Cancellation charges: Should it be necessary to cancel your trip prior to departure, the following penalties will apply:

Australia Itinerary

September 11 to 29, 2020

Day 1-2 – Depart for Melbourne, Australia

Adventure of a lifetime awaits! Depart Toronto and skip across the international dateline on your way to explore the Land Down Under.

Day 3 – Melbourne

Day 4 – Melbourne

Day 10 – Alice Springs/ Uluru (Ayers Rock)

Traverse to the "Red Centre" as you travel to Uluru, the Aboriginal name for Ayers Rock. This huge stone and the sandstone dome known as Kata Tjuta were created through the process of upheaval and erosion. Prepare for a truly majestic evening while you enjoy a sunset champagne toast as you witness the changing colours of Uluru.

Day 11 – Cairns

In the morning head to the base of Ayers Rock to learn about its geology and significance to the Aboriginal culture before flying to Cairns home of the world's most spectacular natural attractions; the Great Barrier Reef. The reef is a haven for thousands of species of sea life, as well as turtles and birds.

Day 12 – Cairns

Today board the Skyrail Rainforest Cableway for a ride above the rainforest canopy. An opportunity to get off the cableway and experience the forests floor's diversity of plants, birds and animals. Includes dinner.

Day 13 – Cairns/Great Barrier Reef

Board a catamaran and sail to the Low Isles to explore the fascinating underwater world of the Great Barrier Reef. Choose how you want to spend your day in paradise by making your time on the reef as educational or as laid back as you like. Feel adventurous? Choose to snorkel uncovering a wealth of vibrant sea life. Includes lunch.

Day 14 – Cairns
