


MANITOULIN: "SPIRIT ISLAND"

■ WEDNESDAY, JULY 28

Begin the day by meeting our local guide and discover how Wiikwemkoong came to be Canada's only officially recognized unceded territory. Visit the James Mishibinijima Art Gallery to understand how art relates to the stories and legends of the Island's history. Lunch is next – a cultural experience highlighting the traditional foods and ingredients utilized today and in the past. After lunch, learn the significance and performance of the hand drum. Time to stretch our legs on a gentle hike with our guide who will explain the medicinal, spiritual and practical uses of the plants found along the trail. Tonight, enjoy a well-deserved relaxing evening.

THURSDAY, JULY 29

Today, depart for home a little bit wiser on Sudbury's geology and respect for Manitoulin's Island spirit. We begin our journey home by boarding the MS Chi-Cheemaun ferry for a two-hour crossing to Tobermory and then continue our journey home.
