SUNDAY, AUGUST 22

Arrive at Calgary International airport. Spend the next three nights in Calgary. Accommodations: Delta by Marriott Calgary Downtown or similar

After breakfast, spend a full day with our local guide on a tour of the Drumheller area. We will visit the Atlas Coal Mine National Historic Site, marvel at the hoodoos also known as mushroom rocks, view the badlands and visit the Royal Tyrrell Museum.

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 25

Following an early breakfast, leave for the Glengary Bison Farm which produces and promotes top quality bison for breeding. Next, visit the Bomber Command Museum in Nanton. Enjoy a guided tour to learn about the Lancaster bomber and the British designed "Anson plane" plus much more. We will also visit the Canadian Grain Elevator Discovery Centre. Alberta's grain elevators are iconic symbols of the Prairies where harvests were weighed, stored, sold and shipped by rail, and are now being reimagined. **Accommodations:** Fairfield Inn & Suites Lethbridge or similar

THURSDAY, AUGUST 26

Today, meet our park interpreter at Writing on Stone Provincial Park for a guided walking tour of the Archaeological Preserve. Here, Indigenous people came for centuries and recorded their experiences and visions on the sandstone cliffs of the Milk River Valley. This extensive rock art collection depicts generations of knowledge, traditions and history.

Following an early breakfast, leave for Waterton National Park. Enjoy our narrated cruise on Waterton Lake followed by lunch at the Prince of Wales Hotel. In the afternoon, visit the town of Fort Macleod.

Cancellation charges: Should it be necessary to cancel your trip prior to departure, the following penalties will apply:

60 days or more prior	Deposit non-refundable
59 to 30 days prior	50% non-refundable
30 to 0 days prior	100% non-refundable

The day of departure is excluded when calculating cancellation charges. CAA strongly recommends the purchase of cancellation insurance.

Local laws and customs: The Government of Ontario requires that residents travelling out of province to be advised that there may be different living standards with respect to the provision of utilities, services and accommodations outside of Ontario. Travel Act Regulation 38(06)

Active Pace: To truly experience the destination, traveller should to be able to participate in physical activities such as longer walking tours, uneven surfaces, climbing stairs and longer periods of standing. Touring days are typically longer with some activities occurring into the evening.

SATURDAY, AUGUST 28

After a busy couple of days in the Lethbridge area, we return to Calgary. Enjoy lunch at the Eau Claire Distillery, followed by a visit to the Yamnuska Wolfdog Sanctuary, a non-profit organization that promotes responsible wolfdog ownership by providing a variety of educational programs. We also touch on the importance of preserving wolves in the wild! On top of the educational programs, the Sanctuary oversees the rescue and safe sanctuary for wolfdogs that have been neglected, abandoned, or otherwise displaced.

SUNDAY, AUGUST 29

This morning, leave for Lake Louise and Moraine Lake with a photo stop at the Fairmont Chateau Lake Louise. Lunch follows at the Lake Louise Railway Station and Restaurant. We then continue to Moraine Lake where the water is the most amazing colour – a vivid shade of turquoise that changes in intensity through the summer as the glaciers melt. Set in the rugged Valley of the Ten Peaks, Moraine Lake is surrounded by mountains, waterfalls, and rock piles, creating a scene so stunning it almost seems unreal. Sit lakeside and absorb the sights and pure mountain air. Our next stop is at the Ammolite Factory before returning to Calgary. Established in 1987, the Ammonite Factory is licensed to mine for the unique and rare ammolite gemstone. The beautiful ammolite products are designed and hand crafted in the workshop within their retail store.

MONDAY, AUGUST 30

Free day to relax and explore Calgary. Optional tour to Dinosaur Provincial Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, for a guided hike in the natural preserve that is only accessible with a park guide **(Additonal cost \$TBA)**. Farewell dinner is included tonight.

TUESDAY, AUGUST 31

Every tour has an end and today is ours. We return home with incredible memories and photographs, new friends, maybe straw in our pockets and with an everlasting respect for the beauty of nature in Southern Alberta.
