THURSDAY, MAY 5

Arrive at Victoria International airport. On the way to our hotel, a stop will be made for snacks and refreshments. Spend the next three nights in beautiful Victoria, considered one of the most beautiful cities in the world. **Accommodations:** Fairmont Empress or similar

FRIDAY, MAY 6

This morning, we meet our step on guide for a three-hour tour of Victoria, the capital of British Columbia. The afternoon is free for you to explore the beautiful city of Victoria. Dinner and evening on own tonight.

SATURDAY, MAY 7

Following breakfast, we leave for breathtaking Butchart Gardens. A former quarry haven, overflowing with lush greens and colourful blooms. This afternoon enjoy a three-hour whale watching expedition in the waters off Victoria. While we cannot guarantee whale sightings, spring and summer offer the best times to spot different species of whales and marine life. Dinner on your own tonight.

SUNDAY, MAY 8

Following an early breakfast, we leave for Duncan. Duncan is home to the Pacific Northwest Raptor Center composed of a group of biologists and falconers. The center was created to bring people closer to the birds of prey who have always inspired awe, but they are also vulnerable. The goal is to educate, illuminate and encourage a sense of personal responsibility. **Accommodations:** Beach Club Resort, Parksville or similar

MONDAY, MAY 9

Today we visit the Vancouver Island University Deep Bay Marine Research Field Station- a marine biological research facility for shellfish research. See a wide variety of local species in the aquariums and touch tanks. Explore the wetland habitat adjacent to the station. Next, we drive to Nanaimo for lunch and walking tour if possible. Dinner and evening on own.

TUESDAY, MAY 10

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Following an early breakfast, we leave for Cathedral Grove in Macmillan Provincial Park where some scenes for Star Wars Return of the Jedi was filmed. If available, a local naturalist will explain some of the wonders of the old growth forest. Following lunch and a walking tour of Tofino, we visit the Kwistis Visitor Center, which focuses on the natural and cultural heritage of the Pacific Rim National Park Reserve. Dinner is included tonight.

Accommodations: Black Rock Oceanfront Resort, Ucluelet or similar

WEDNESDAY, MAY 11

Today is a free day to enjoy the area, take a hike or relax at the resort. Optional excursions are offered. Take a 5.5-hour Archipelago Wildlife Cruise with lunch or hike Pacific Rim Park Reserve. Alternatively, enjoy a day of shopping in Tofino or relax at the resort.

THURSDAY, MAY 12

This morning, we leave for Duke Point Ferry Terminal where we board the ferry to Tsawwassen Terminal where we disembark . We are now in Vancouver for the next three nights. Evening and dinner on own.

Accommodations: Opus Vancouver or similar

FRIDAY, MAY 13

After our breakfast we meet our local guide for Vancouver. We will visit Queen Elizabeth Gardens (includes a walking tour), Chinatown (includes a walk thru the Chinese Garden) Gastown, Canada Place – photo stop, Stanley Park with native history and Fish Hatchery. Evening and Dinner on own.

SATURDAY, MAY 14

Today is free to enjoy Vancouver. At night, we gather for a Farewell dinner.

SUNDAY, MAY 15

Every tour has an end and to today is ours. We return home with incredible memories, new friends and everlasting respect for nature .

Cancellation charges: Should it be necessary to cancel your trip prior to departure, the following penalties will apply:

60 days or more prior	Deposit non-refundable
59 to 30 days prior	50% non-refundable
29 to 0 days prior	100% non-refundable

The day of departure is excluded when calculating cancellation charges. CAA strongly recommends the purchase of cancellation insurance.
