MONDAY, JULY 3

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This morning, we cross the Confederation Bridge to Prince Edward Island to visit the Acadian Musical Village which includes a traditional Acadian lunch followed by Acadian music. Then, we check into our hotel, our home for the next two nights

Today, meet our local guide for a tour of historic Charlottetown, visit the Harbour in North Rustico, travel to Prince Edward Island National Park, visit Anne of Green Gables Heritage Home and then, travel to New Glasgow.

WEDNESDAY, JULY 5

Following an early breakfast, we leave for Wood's Island Ferry. We arrive on Cape Breton Island and drive to Sydney , our home away from home for the next two nights.

Today, spend the day on the Cabot Trail, one of the world's most scenic destinations. Our local guide will delight in showing the beauty and wonderment of the Cabot Trail. A stop will be made at the Keltic Lodge for lunch. Return to the hotel by dinnertime.

This morning, we are off to visit the Alexander Graham Bell National Historic Site. After the tour, we slowly travel back for Halifax. Our three-night stay is at the Marriott Halifax Harbourfront.
