



The morning is at leisure until our late check out followed by a guided tour of Quebec City. After the tour, we leave for the Port of Quebec where we will board the M/V Canadian Empress , a nostalgic replica steamboat. Enjoy a calm-water cruising on a classic Canadian riverboat to begin our Canadian Connection Cruise West.

### **■ WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 6**

This morning we depart Quebec City for Trois Rivieres. Once in Trois Rivieres we will have a brief bus tour of the city. We have a choice of visiting the Shrine at Cap de la Madeleine or a guided tour of the Borealis Industrial Museum . Enjoy the Port of Trois Rivieres ambiance. Late evening entertainment and lounge services are provided tonight.

#### THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 7

Today, we depart Trois Rivieres and bound for Montreal . Partake in the shipboard activities or watch the world go by. In mid – afternoon, we arrive at the Old Port of Montreal. Time to board a motorcoach for a guided tour of Montreal. After the tour we reboard the ship and leave for Lachine. Along the way, we transit through the St. Lambert and Ste. Catherine Locks to enter the St. Lawrence Seaway System. Enjoy entertainment and lounge services tonight.

#### FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 8

We begin the day with an early sail to Morrisburg, passing through the Lower and Upper Beauharnois Locks. Later in the afternoon we pass through the Eisenhower and Snell Locks in the US which takes us in the Lake St. Lawrence. We dock at the Crysler Park Marina in Morrisburg, ON. This evening relax and stroll the grounds of the marina. Entertainment is provided tonight.

#### SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 9

B,L,D

After breakfast we depart by miniature train for a guided tour of Upper Canada Village. In the early afternoon we continue our journey to Prescott. Along the way we sail through the lock at the Seaway Control Dam Iroquois. By mid afternoon, we secure at Prescott and enjoy a guided tour of Fort Wellington. A late departure for Brockville is scheduled and by evening we arrive at Brockville "The City of the 1000 Islands"

#### SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 10

B, L, D

This morning, enjoy a guided tour of the Fulford Mansion followed with mid morning departure for Gananoque. Along the way, we will cruise through Millionaires' Row and experience the beauty of the 1000 Islands. This evening we have Celebration Night with fun-loving entertainment.

#### MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 11

Our last breakfast will be while cruising through the 1000 Islands. We return to Gananoque for a guided tours of the 1000 Islands Heritage Museum or 1000 Islands Boat Museum. Following these tours we sail through the Canadian Channel en route to Kingston. Our last tour will be of the Kingston Harbour, ending at the Crawford Dock. We bid farewell to the ship crew taking with us wonderful memories, and feeling much more relaxed. Time to board our land transportation to return home.
