DAY 1

Arrive at Deer Lake and transfer to your hotel. This evening, enjoy a get together with your fellow travellers. Overnight Corner Brook/Deer Lake.

DAY 2

B, L, D

This morning, take the Viking trail to beautiful Gros Morne National Park. Travel along some of the most spectacular coastline and visit the National Historic Park at Port au Choix, which interprets the intriguing history and lifestyle of the Maritime Archaic people who lived here 3000 years ago.

Overnight Plum Point for two nights

DAY 3

B, L

Today, travel the coastline to St. Anthony to visit the home of the famous medical missionary, Sir Wilfred Grenfell. The highlight of this day is our visit to the UNESCO World Heritage site at L'Anse aux Meadows, home of the Viking people who settled this area in the year 1000 A.D.

DAY 4

B, L

Keep a sharp eye out for whales as we travel across the Straits of Belle Isle to the shores of Labrador. Here, visit the Whaling Station founded by the Basques in the early 1500's, and learn about the whalers' "modern techniques". Later, visit the province's tallest lighthouse at L'Anse Amour. Overnight L'Anse au Clair.

DAY 5

B, D

This morning, return to the island to explore the rugged coastline, stopping at The Arches to enjoy an interpretation of the unique and wonderful geological formations for which Newfoundland is so famous. Tonight, enjoy a traditional Newfoundland dinner. Overnight Rocky Harbour/Cow Head for two nights.

DAY 6

B, L

Following breakfast, take a boat tour across beautiful Bonne Bay to Woody Point to spend time in Gros Morne National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. We visit the Discovery Centre and view the famous Tableland Mountains. This area is nicknamed the 'Galapagos of Plate Tectonics'.

DAY 7

B, L, D

Today, trek eastward, to a new geological frontier. A beautiful harbor provides the perfect backdrop for an eventful morning of whale interpretation and art exhibits. This afternoon commemorates the survivors of the 9/11 Tragedy and the many acts of kindness extended when we welcomed the "Come From Away" guests into the homes and communities surrounding Gander. Overnight Gander.

DAY 8

B, L, D

This morning, travel the "Road to the Isles" before travelling across "Tickles and Runs" to spend time on beautiful Twillingate Island, one of Newfoundland's oldest and most interesting fishing communities. We then travel to Terra Nova National Park to view the vistas of Newman Sound.

Overnight Clarenville for two nights.

DAY 9

B, L

Following breakfast, travel to the historic town of Trinity, one of the oldest communities in North America, the gem of the Island. Then, it's out to Cape Bonavista to walk the cliffs to enjoy the spectacular coastal scenery. Later spend time in Bonavista, the landfall of John Cabot in 1497. Visit Ryan Premises to learn about inshore fishing techniques that have allowed this town to thrive for hundreds of years.

DAY 10

B, L

Today, travel to the Avalon Peninsula to the town of Bay Bulls. Take a boat trip to the Witless Bay Ecological Reserve to view thousands of Atlantic Puffins, Murres and other seabirds that nest here in the summer. Witless Bay is also home to many Humpback, Minke, and Fin whales in the summer months so sightings are a definite possibility. This afternoon, visit Cape Spear National Historic Park before heading into St. John's, the province of Newfoundland and Labrador's capital. Overnight St. John's for two nights

DAY 11

B, D

This morning, tour historic St. John's, the oldest city in North America. This trip includes a visit to Cabot Tower and Signal Hill, where we can view the famous "Narrows" and admire the architecture of old St. John's. The afternoon is free. This evening, share in our farewell dinner.

DAY 12

B

Today, we bid a fond farewell to our newest yet oldest province as we fly home with many delightful memories of an authentic Newfoundland experience.

How to book: Reservations may be made through any CAA Niagara office. A non-refundable deposit of \$500 per person is due at time of booking. Balance of payment is due on March 24/April 19. Cancellation charges: Should it be necessary to cancel your trip prior to departure, the following penalties will apply:
