■ THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 4

Our early morning departure takes us through New York State with frequent breaks along the way.

Accommodation: Hampton Inn Chicopee, MA or similar

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 5

B.D

After breakfast, meet our guide who will conduct a tour of Cape Cod's oldest town – Sandwich. View the Village Green, the Salt Marsh, a Cranberry Bog, and Cape Cod Bay. Followed by a visit to the Cape Cod Visitor Center to see the Cape Cod Canal and learn its history and how it works. Enjoy lunch on your own. This afternoon, head to The Sandwich Glass Museum and watch molten glass drawn from the furnace, blown, and pressed into exquisite shapes. Then travel to the Mid-Cape for a guided tour of Hyannis including the John F. Kennedy Memorial, the Korean War Memorial, Hyannis Port, and a view of St. Francis Xavier Church, the summer parish of the Kennedy Family. A Lobster Dinner is included tonight.

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 6

Our local guide takes us along Route 6A, a scenic byway winding through centuries of Cape Cod history. View a Windmill, a Cape Cod Lighthouse and visit the Cape Cod National Seashore Visitor's Centre. Sand dunes and the ocean surround us as we approach "Land's Ends"- Provincetown. This afternoon, choose to either board an excursion vessel for a whale watching experience or stay on land for a scenic dune excursion. Onboard the vessel a naturalist will answer questions about the whales, birds, fish and lighthouses. If you choose to stay on land, enjoy a guided dune tour of the largest protected coastline in America. Tonight, dinner is included.

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 7

Enjoy breakfast, and then depart for Rhode Island, the "Ocean State" to meet our local guide for a tour of Newport, America's first resort town. Take in the rugged beauty of Ten-Mile Ocean Drive and fabulous mansions along tree-lined Bellevue Avenue. Enjoy free time for lunch on the historic downtown waterfront filled with cobblestone shopping wharves lined with antique stores, art galleries, specialty shops and restaurants. Take a self-guided tour of the Breakers Mansion, the grandest of Newport's summer "cottages". Dinner is included this evening.

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 8

This morning, our local tour guide escorts us to Woods Hole, home to the renowned Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution, and the national headquarters of the International Wildlife Coalition. Here the coach and passengers board the ferry for Martha's Vineyard. Upon arrival our local guide will conduct a "Down Island" Tour. Learn about the history and lifestyles of the islanders as we pass through the picturesque villages. There is free time for lunch on our own in the historic whaling town of Edgartown. Complete the day on the island in Oak Bluffs strolling through "Cottage City" with its brightly painted cottages and decorative "gingerbread" trim. Dinner is included this evening.

■ TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 9

After breakfast, our guide will conduct a tour of America's Hometown – Plymouth. As one of the country's first settlements, it is well known in the United States for its historical value. A stop will be made at the Forefather's Monument. Picture stops will be made at Plymouth Rock, the traditional site of disembarkation of the Pilgrims in 1620 and the Mayflower II. Board the Lobster Tales Cruise to learn about the many creatures that live in Plymouth Harbor. Experience a "hands-on" approach to see how lobsters are harvested from their natural environment. Tonight, dinner is at the Salem Cross Inn, for a fireplace feast.
