SUNDAY, JUNE 8

Depart Toronto for Vancouver, BC. Spend time in this beautiful city exploring and relaxing. Overnight Vancouver for two nights.

After breakfast, enjoy a guided tour of Vancouver's spectacular North Shore with breath-taking views of the city, ocean, and surrounding mountains. Highlights include the Capilano Suspension Bridge and the Grouse Mountain Skyride. Followed by free time to discover the city on your own.

TUESDAY, JUNE 10

Today, travel onboard the Rocky Mountaineer from the coastal city of Vancouver to Kamloops, located in the heart of British Columbia's interior. View dramatic changes in scenery, from the lush green fields of the Fraser Valley, through forests and winding river canyons surrounded by the peaks of the Coast and Cascade Mountains, to the desert-like environment of the BC interior. Highlights include the rushing waters of Hell's Gate in the Fraser Canyon and the steep slopes and rock sheds along the Thompson River. The day concludes as the Rocky Mountaineer travels the shores of Kamloops Lake into Kamloops. Overnight in Kamloops.

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 11

Board the Rocky Mountaineer train at the Kamloops Station to continue your Goldleaf journey east to the mighty Canadian Rockies and the province of Alberta. Travel across ranch lands, along rocky lakeshores, over high mountain passes and through the remarkable tunnels that form part of the rich rail history of the Canadian Rockies. Highlights include Craigellachie, where the last spike of the Canadian Pacific Railway was driven, the climb over Rogers Pass, the Kicking Horse Canyon, the Spiral Tunnels and the glaciers and snow-capped peaks of the Canadian Rockies. Transfer to your Banff hotel for your three-night stay. **Accommodation:** Fox Hotel & Suites or similar

THURSDAY, JUNE 12

B, L

Enjoy a full day of sightseeing in Banff and Yoho National Park, travelling along the Bow Valley Parkway. Yoho National Park offers magnificent natural wonders like the Spiral Tunnels, the serene turquoise waters of Emerald Lake and a natural Rock Bridge spanning the Kicking Horse River. Highlights also include Lake Louise and Takakkaw Falls. Return to Banff in the late afternoon.

FRIDAY, JUNE 13

B, L

Enjoy a full day sightseeing tour along the magnificent Icefields Parkway travelling to the Columbia Icefields. This icefield is one of the largest accumulations of ice south of the Arctic Circle. Ride a unique Ice Explorer onto the Athabasca Glacier and learn more about its geological features. Enjoy a walk on the Glacier Skywalk, extending 98 feet out over the Sunwapta Valley. Arrive back in Banff in the late afternoon.

SATURDAY, JUNE 14

B

Today, enjoy a full-day tour concluding in Calgary. Begin the morning with a sightseeing tour of Banff. Among the points of interest are Surprise Corner, the Hoodoos rock formation, and Tunnel Mountain Drive. Banff Gondola ride is included. Continue to Calgary for your overnight stay.

After breakfast, we say good-bye to the incredible west and transfer to the airport for our return flight to Toronto.

How to book: Reservations may be made through any CAA Niagara office. A non-refundable deposit of \$700 per person is due at time of booking. Balance of payment is due March 8, 2025. Bookings made after March 8 will require full payment at time of booking. CAA strongly recommends the purchase of travel insurance. Ask for details.

Cancellation charges: Should it be necessary to cancel your trip prior to departure, the following penalties will apply:

Prior to March 8	Deposits paid are non-refundable
March 9 to April 7	50% non-refundable
April 8 to June 8	100% non-refundable

The day of departure is excluded when calculating cancellation charges. CAA strongly recommends the purchase of cancellation insurance.

Local laws and customs: The Government of Ontario requires that residents travelling out of province to be advised that there may be different living standards with respect to the provision of utilities, services and accommodations outside of Ontario. Travel Act Regulation 38(06)

Moderate Pace: Tour requires average physical activity. Traveller should be in good physical health, able to climb stairs, be comfortable standing, and walking moderate distances including uneven surfaces. Itineraries typically include more longer than shorter days.
