

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 20

Overnight flight, from Toronto to Edinburgh

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 21

DW

Arrive in Scotland. Check in at your hotel and relax. Enjoy a Welcome Dinner this evening. Accommodations: Malmaison Hotel Edinburgh or similar

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 22

Join a Local Expert to see the highlights of Edinburgh. In the Old Town, view the Palace of Holyroodhouse, the official Scottish residence of the Queen. Drive along Princes Street to the ornate Scott Memorial, then see the 18th century New Town with its neoclassical Georgian facades. Venture up the Royal Mile to visit Edinburgh Castle, home of Mons Meg, the Stone of Destiny and Scotland's Crown Jewels, the Honours of Scotland. The rest of the day is at leisure.

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 23

B,AT,DW

Cross the Firth of Forth into Fife and journey to St. Andrews, passing the Old Course, home of golf since its creation in the 15th century. Enjoy free time to explore. Options include strolling to West Sands Beach or wandering to St. Andrews University. Continue via Blair Atholl and pass the Grampian Mountains on the way to Spey Valley. Stop at Atholl Palace and Gardens for a delicious cream tea. Originally open in Victorian times, the hotel retains many traditional features.

THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 24

Keep your eyes peeled for the Loch Ness monster during a scenic drive along the legendary lake. See Culloden Moor in the morning, where Bonnie Prince Charlie's Jacobite army was crushed in 1746. Visit the Culloden Visitor Centre. Next, follow the rugged coast north to the fishing port of Wick. Choose to visit the Old Pulteney Distillery to taste a wee dram of whistey or visit the highly rated. Distillery to taste a wee dram of whiskey or visit the highly rated Wick Heritage Museum and hear about the past of this once thriving fishing community.

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 25

Board a ferry to the Orkney Islands where the countryside is breathtakingly majestic, and the tranquility supports a quieter pace of life. Here the hardy locals say they live "below the wind and above the water." Visit the 5,000-year-old village of Skara Brae, the mysterious Ring of Brodgar, Kirkwall and the small chapel built by Italian prisoners in WWII.

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 26

Travel through stunning landscapes along the north coast with its white sandy beaches, and inland to misty valleys and glens, lochs and rushing waters. Then it's 'Over the Sea to Skye,' the largest and most beautiful island of the Inner Hebrides. On the way to Broadford, learn the tale of how young Flora MacDonald helped rescue Bonnie Prince Charlie and see the dramatic Cuillin Hills. Accommodations: The Dunollie Hotel, Broadford or similar

■ SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 27

Explore this wild and beautiful island on your own, before crossing to the Kyle of Lochalsh. Stop for a photo at the remote Eilean Donan Castle. Move on to the WWII Commando Memorial where there is a fine view of Ben Nevis, Britain's highest mountain. Enjoy more spectacular scenery en route to the Valley of Glencoe. Join a local ranger for a MAKE TRAVEL MATTER Experience and learn about the protection of this rare ecosystem. In the evening, enjoy marketfresh Scottish ingredients and wine, as you get together with your new friends for a sumptuous Celebration Dinner. Accommodations: Ballachulish Hotel, Glencoe or similar

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 28

Spend time around peaceful Loch Lomond, 'Queen of Scottish Lochs' according to Sir Walter Scott and the largest in Great Britain. Consider experiencing the beauty of the loch with an optional cruise before continuing to Glasgow. An orientation drive through the city will show you the grand public buildings, including George Square and St. Mungo's Cathedral. Then the rest of the afternoon is yours to explore at leisure.
