■ MONDAY, AUGUST 17

Arrive at Deer Lake and transfer to your hotel. This evening, enjoy a get together with your fellow travellers. Overnight Corner Brook/Deer Lake.

■ TUESDAY, AUGUST 18

This morning, take the Viking trail to beautiful Gros Morne National Park. Travel along some of the most spectacular coastlines and visit the National Historic Park at Port au Choix, which interprets the intriguing history and lifestyle of the Maritime Archaic people who lived here 3000 years ago.

■ WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 19

Today, travel the coastline to St. Anthony to visit the home of the famous medical missionary, Sir Wilfred Grenfell. The highlight of this day is our visit to the UNESCO World Heritage site at L'Anse aux Meadows, home of the Viking people who settled this area in the year 1000 A.D.

■ THURSDAY, AUGUST 20

B, L

Keep a sharp eye out for whales as we travel across the Straits of Belle Isle to the shores of Labrador. Here, visit the Whaling Station founded by the Basques in the early 1500's, and learn about the whalers' "modern techniques". Later, visit the province's tallest lighthouse at L'Anse Amour.

■ FRIDAY, AUGUST 21

This morning, return to the island to explore the rugged coastline, stopping at The Arches to enjoy an interpretation of the unique and wonderful geological formations for which Newfoundland is so famous. Tonight, enjoy a traditional Newfoundland dinner.

■ SATURDAY, AUGUST 22

B, L

Following breakfast, take a boat tour across beautiful Bonne Bay to Woody Point to spend time in Gros Morne National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. We visit the Discovery Centre and view the famous Tableland Mountains. This area is nicknamed the 'Galapagos of Plate Tectonics'.

■ SUNDAY, AUGUST 23

B, L, D

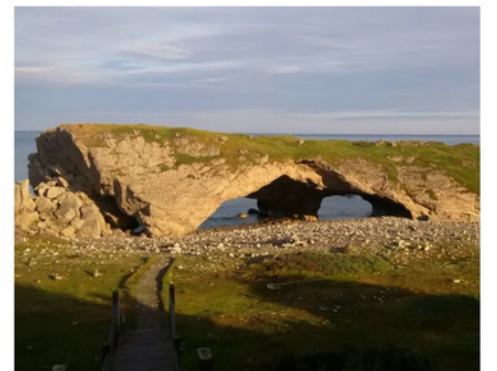
Today, trek eastward, to a new geological frontier. A beautiful harbor provides the perfect backdrop for an eventful morning of whale interpretation and art exhibits. This morning, travel the “Road to the Isles” before travelling across “Tickles and Runs” to spend time on beautiful Twillingate Island, one of Newfoundland’s oldest and most interesting fishing communities. Then travel to Terra Nova National Park to view the vistas of Newman Sound.

Overnight Clarenville for two nights.

TUESDAY, AUGUST 25

B, L

Following breakfast, travel to the historic town of Trinity, one of the oldest communities in North America, the gem of the Island. Then, it’s out to Cape Bonavista to walk the cliffs to enjoy the spectacular coastal scenery. Later spend time in Bonavista, the landfall of John Cabot in 1497. Visit Ryan Premises to learn about inshore fishing techniques that have allowed this town to thrive for hundreds of years.

Today, travel to the Avalon Peninsula to the town of Bay Bulls. Take a boat trip to the Witless Bay Ecological Reserve to view thousands of Atlantic Puffins, Murres and other seabirds that nest here in the summer. Witless Bay is also home to many Humpback, Minke, and Fin whales in the summer months so sightings are a possibility. This afternoon, visit Cape Spear National Historic Park before heading into St. John’s.

How to book: Reservations may be made through any CAA Niagara office with a travel agent. A non-refundable deposit of \$500 per person is due at time of booking. Balance of payment is due, April 17, 2026. CAA strongly recommends the purchase of travel insurance. Ask for details.

Cancellation charges: Should it be necessary to cancel your trip prior to departure, the following penalties will apply:

Prior to April 17 2026	Deposit paid non-refundable
April 18 to 0 days prior	100% non-refundable

The day of departure is excluded when calculating cancellation charges. CAA strongly recommends the purchase of cancellation insurance.
