Thursday, August 31

This afternoon, we cross the Confederation Bridge and check into the Delta Prince Edward Hotel in Charlottetown, our home for the next two nights. Tonight, enjoy the famous PEI lobster dinner.

tour Anne of Green Gables Heritage Home, the Farmers Bank of North Rustico and the Prince Edward Island Preserve Company.
