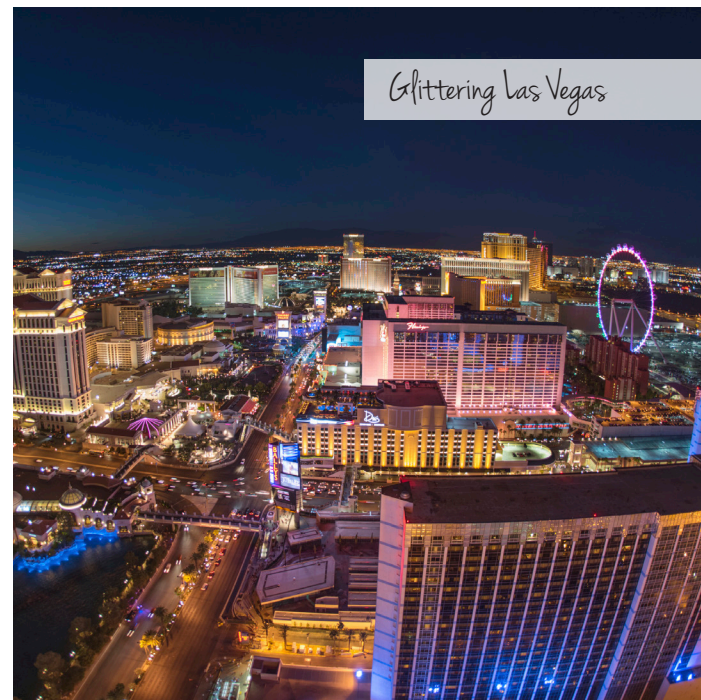

Tuesday, October 24

Travel day to Sedona, Arizona. Sedona is surrounded by red-rock buttes, steep canyons walls and pine forests and is also noted for its vibrant art community. Upon arrival in Sedona, we check into our hotel for the night. Dinner on our own tonight.

Wednesday, October 25

This morning, enjoy a tour of Sedona with a local guide and in late afternoon, leave for the Grand Canyon South Rim, for our two nights stay.

Thursday, October 26

Today, we begin our full Grand Canyon adventure with the Grand Canyon IMAX movie. The Grand Canyon is one of the most remarkable natural wonders in the world and has one of the deepest gorges on earth. We will explore the South Rim of Grand Canyon National Park with frequent picture stops. The afternoon is free.

Friday, October 27

CB,D

Our destination today is Page, Arizona. This afternoon, enjoy a narrated cruise on Lake Powell in the Antelope Canyon. Lake Powell is set amid striking red-rocks formations, sharply cut canyons and dramatic desert scenery. It is also the second largest artificial reservoir in the U.S.A. Then it is off to our "home away from home" for the next two nights. This evening, enjoy a dinner show featuring traditional Navajo dancing and food.

Saturday, October 28

CB,L

Today, we travel to Monument Valley Navajo Tribal Park where we will be captivated by the classic southwestern scenery of flat-topped sandstone mesas and buttes. This Monument Valley Landscape may seem familiar to us because it was the location in countless Hollywood Westerns. Lunch and a guided tour is included.

Sunday, October 29

CB,L,D

This morning, travel to the Bryce Canyon National Park with a luncheon stop in Kanab, Utah. Before Kanab became accessible by road it was an isolated Mormon community, and in the 1920's filmmakers discovered it. It soon earned the nickname of "Utah's Little Hollywood" as many western movies were filmed here. We continue to Bryce Canyon National Park for a guided tour of its crimson-colored hoodoos or spire-shaped rock formations.

Monday, October 30

B

Today's adventure is at Zion National Park in the Southwestern corner of Utah. Be a spectator to an endless supply of remarkable natural beauty. The area is restful and a rejuvenation haven for everyone. In mid-afternoon, we leave for Las Vegas a fascinating contrast to our road trip around the national parks. Our next two nights will be in Las Vegas, a world gambling destination with a surprisingly posh urban vibe and an artistic side. Dinner on own tonight.

Tuesday, October 31

B

This morning, enjoy a tour to Hoover Dam (once known as the Boulder Dam). It was built to tame the Colorado River and provide water and hydroelectric power for the developing southwest. This National Historic Landmark stores enough water in Lake Mead to irrigate two million acres and serves as a popular tourist destination. The afternoon is free. *Note: Restrictions apply to Hoover Dam, ask you CAA Tour Director.*

Wednesday, November 1

B

We have been spectators to amazing panoramic views and have witnessed nature's power as we visited the canyons. We fly homeward with everlasting memories of a scenic holiday.

How to book: Reservations may be made through any CAA office. A non-refundable deposit of \$250 per person is due at time of booking. Balance of payment is due 60 days prior to departure, August 24. Bookings made after this date will require full payment at time of booking. CAA strongly recommends the purchase of travel insurance. Ask for details.

Cancellation charges: Deposits are non-refundable. Should it be necessary to cancel your trip prior to departure, the following penalties will apply:

60 days or more prior	Deposit non-refundable
59 to 30 days prior	50 % non-refundable
29 to 0 days prior	100% non-refundable

The day of departure is excluded when calculating cancellation charges. CAA strongly recommends the purchase of cancellation insurance.
