Voting will remain open until April 19, 2024. In 2023, Portage Road in Niagara Falls took top spot as Niagara's Worst Road followed by Ontario Street in St. Catharines then Lundy's Lane, Willoughby Drive and Drummond Road in Niagara Falls.
